Internationalization at home is a set of different activities designed to develop intercultural and international competencies without any physical mobility.





UNDERSTANDING COIL

COIL is

an innovative method of teaching and learning, leveraging online technologies to deliver global learning and cross-cultural experiences in the classroom an innovative pedagogy that involves collaborative teaching and learning between two or more countries in which work is facilitated by online communication.

This collaboration happens in any format course that teachers lead.

an academic content lesson, as well as crosscultural communication and collaboration, for both students and teachers. It can be developed in a couple of lessons or in an entire course.





UNDERSTANDING COIL

COIL's principles

COIL collaboration should be equitable and inclusive

COIL goal is to give students meaningful learning opportunities to connect with each other through share readings, activities, and discussions

Be sure to inform your students about the purpose and requirements of COIL activities, including how COIL helps facilitate the course's learning objectives

Incorporate a reflection activity to help students evaluate what they have learned by working with one another.





UNDERSTANDING COIL

COIL's basic components

COIL can be created in any discipline; Interdisciplinary collaborations work well Encourage active student learning and teamwork

Are a graded activity in each participating class

Are usually mostly asynchronous with some synchronous activities

Include an emphasis on cross-cultural interactions and understanding

Can use any technology tools that serve the learning goals





STRATEGIES FOR A SUCCESSFUL COIL IMPLEMENTATION

Stretch your creativity for COIL activities

Technology used should be accessible to all students

Technology used should support the shared learning objectives

Plan time for ice breaker activities to help students from the two institutions get to know each other

COIL course will evolve

COIL activities should advance the course learning objectives





STRATEGIES FOR A SUCCESSFUL COIL IMPLEMENTATION

Collaborative Online International Learning can be successful between classes in the same or related disciplines as well as classes across disciplines.

In fact, interdisciplinary pairings often result in some of the most creative and engaging collaborations.

One of the great opportunities of a COIL is to infuse the courses with interactive, intercultural activities.
